At the top of the hill a very friendly man on the other side of the road was yelling, "Here comes an Ironman!" I finally had to respond, "This is not my bike. It's my daughter's. She is coming behind." I should have left that last bit off because then I could hear him calling every woman who was coming along behind, "Ironman!"
