And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.

Colossians 1:18

At school in England we had "head boys". All the pupils belonged to one of four "houses" and each house had its own head boy. They had a certain amount of clout and the rest of us knew better than to mess with them. As a result, I like to think that I did not grow up without an appreciation for authority. There is danger, though, that I could still have an inadequate understanding of what this passage says about Jesus. I mean His authority does not come from the fact that he is one of the oldest boys, although He is "The Ancient of Days"

I watched until the thrones were thrown up, and the Ancient of Days sat, whose robe was white as snow, and the hair of His head like the pure wool. His throne was like flames of fire, and His wheels like burning fire. Daniel 7:9

Neither does His authority come from the fact that He has passed all his exams successfully, although I know He is smarter than me.

...in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Colossians 2:3

Like a head boy, Jesus has the approval of those above him...

And suddenly a voice came from heaven, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

So that's it! He is God's Son and obviously I cannot compete with that qualification. If He were not in the picture, you and I would have a chance at being the head, right? If He had just stayed in Heaven we could all take turns, or just fight it out to see who the head will be. Maybe God's idea is better after all. But why should we trust His Son; what makes Him different? Maybe it is the fact that He came into this world after we had tried to destroy each other by destroying God, and when Jesus came into this world we made it clear that we did not want Him to be head of our lives. He was the Son of God, but He bled just like you and me. He breathed His last, as all men must. He went the way of all men when all is said and done.

But all is not said, of course. He came back to life and breathed again, and so will you and I, because as it goes with Jesus, so it goes with us. He is the firstborn over all creation (Colossians 1:15). If there is no Jesus in this world then there is no world. He is also the firstborn from the dead; if there is no Jesus coming out of that grave, then there is nobody coming out of any grave. As certain as we are breathing now, we will be resurrected to stand before Him for judgment. He is responsible for the creation and for the new creation.

I'd say that makes Him the One who should be the Head of it all. Wouldn't you?
