## Don't give up!

There is a certain inevitability about the direction that mankind is taking. Jesus said:"Woe to the world because of offenses! For offenses must come, but woe to that man by whom the offense comes!" Matthew 18:7.

The ultimate inevitability, as far as this world is concerned, is that Jesus Himself will be revealed at any time to execute judgment upon mankind. In the meantime the reality is that those of us who hold to the testimony of Jesus Christ will just have to bear the torment of watching as the world moves further and further away from any pretense of godliness. That torment is tempered by the knowledge that judgment and vindication are inevitable. Add to that the sure hope of a resurrection to eternal life for the church of Christ, and one is caused to wonder why we are troubled. The cross tells me that God loves this world enough to pay such a price to save souls, no matter how few they may be. The cross tells me that God has a hard time giving up on anybody, even me. So, if you are having a hard time with the way this nation is going, don't be surprised, and don't give up. Remember that he saved the likes of you and me from that inevitable sin. Furthermore, if these souls, who now support such things as abortion and homosexuality, repent and turn to the LORD, He will certainly forgive them. Those who promote such activities and demand that we, as a nation, accept them may well be in a different category. As Jesus said, "Woe to them by whom offences come." But those who stumble because of the temptation and deceit of Satan, and who genuinely repent of their sin, will find the God who gave His Son for our sins a loving God indeed.
