The Edges of the Kingdom

As we prepare for our gospel meeting on the theme "When the Kingdom Comes", lets remind ourselves about the questions many are asking about the Kingdom. When did the Kingdom begin, and when will it end?

- 1. Men have always lived under rule in some form.
- 2. Initially, it was simply the rule of God as He spoke to the patriarchs.
- 3. In the beginning, they simply worshiped God, meaning they conformed to His will spiritually and physically.
- 4. Once sin broke the fellowship between man and God, men moved away from God and His voice (rule).
- 5. Therefore, *rule* became "civilized". Mankind began to organize and administer law, and enter into covenants, which were written documents. Families became tribes and then nations, and, though they did not abandon the idea of God (religious obligation), they each desired to have their own ruler of their own lands who was called "King" (civil obligation). When men desire to have their own king, they naturally need their own god. And once you accept that each group can have their own king(s), it follows that they each can have their own god(s).
- 6. God established His Holy Nation by giving them a land and a law and liberty in covenant with Him. The law was spiritual and physical. God was ruler over both.
- 7. As this new nation lived among the other nations, they coveted the glory of their earthly kings. Eventually they demanded a king of their own, and God allowed this. The fact is that Israel had always had a "king", but they now wanted one that they could see. Of course, they also wanted a God that they could see like the gods of the nations around them. They were now idolaters both spiritually and physically.
- God had promised to redeem mankind (Genesis 3:15) and He had promised to use this nation (Israel) for that purpose. The promise involved one person. To Adam and Eve, it was the seed of the woman (Genesis 3:15). To Abraham it was the seed of Abraham (Genesis 22:18). He was to be a prophet like Moses (Deuteronomy 18:18). He would be a priest like Melchizedek (Genesis 14:18-20; Hebrews 6:19), and he was to be a king like David (2 Samuel 7:16; Romans 1:3).
- 9. When God raised Jesus from the dead, and received Him back into Heaven, He made Him king of heaven and earth (Matthew 28:18). He must rule till His last enemy, Death, has been destroyed (1 Corinthians 15:24-26).
- 10. The earthly component of His Kingdom is the Church, and, as such, we recognize that only He can direct our ways spiritually and physically. He told us how to organize, and He provided for elders and deacons to govern or shepherd the local flock by the power of His Word. Our King and our God are one and the same person, and He is not on this earth. That affects our view of government and denominationalism. More on that next week...
