To be baptized into Christ is to give your life to God. As a result of hearing the message of the gospel, your heart is convicted and you know that God is calling your name. All of a sudden everything is very clear...the fog has gone...burned away by the presence of God. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus we would say...

... "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?" Luke 24:32

Now we know that He loves us, and that He wants us to be with Him, and it does not matter if He asks us to do something big or something small. He simply wants to know if I am a *ready* soul. That bush that burned yet was not burned up...guess what? It still has not burned up. God is still calling His people to use as instruments of salvation in this lost world. He does it by calling us first to Him; a ready person does not have to get ready.
