## What a Savior - Arthur Barry

This is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance (and for this we labor and strive), that we have put our hope in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, and especially of those who believe. 1 Timothy 4:9, 10

There is only one Savior, but many who need saving. How can one savior get the job done? If He is all alone in this task, surely some loss is acceptable. Can He realistically be expected to cover every single person equally?

Yes, He can. We can be thankful that He is able to get the job done, but we should be especially thankful that He has the *desire* to save us.

Paul stresses, in 1 Timothy 2:3, that God our Savior wants all men to be saved. Because this is such a priority for Him, He is pleased with us when we "…live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness" (1 Tim 2:2). That should also be a priority for all of us, in which case we will appreciate Paul's instructions in verses 1 and 2 regarding prayer. We should pray for:

- 1. Everyone
- 2. Kings
- 3. All those in authority

No discrimination there. If God has a desire to save every single soul that ever lived then we should be able to pray for them all, shouldn't we? We cannot name everyone, but our attitude should be like that of Jesus. In verse 5 we are told that Jesus "...gave Himself as a ransom for all men..." Did He know that most men could not care less about His sacrifice? Yes, He knew, but that did not stop Him. He either had to give His life for every single one of us or for none of us at all. We might think His sacrifice was a failure because the vast majority of people reject Him. Only a tiny remnant cares about Jesus and shares with Paul in his concerns for the Truth. Jesus is the savior of all men, but few are saved. Similarly, Donald Trump is our President even if we did not all vote for him. Choosing or rejecting Jesus is about who we want to be in charge of everything forever, not just for four years.

Those of us who choose Jesus know we are in a battle to keep the truth pure and to get the truth into the minds and hearts of as many people as possible. In I Timothy 2:1-7 Paul is concerned about the threat from civil governments and urges us to pray for peaceful relations between what we now call "Church and State". In chapter 4 he is concerned about false teachings within the church and instructs Timothy and all of us who care to stand for the truth. There is also the admonition in 4:16 which relates to our question about the mammoth task of saving everyone.

Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.

Together we have the power to save the whole world.
