Priorities

You cannot serve two masters. That is plain enough, isn't it? The parable in Luke 16:1-13 which leads up to that statement, however, has troubled many, because it talks about a corrupt steward who is applauded by his master for basically feathering his own bed. At the very least we can see that this steward had established his priority and was sticking to it. When threatened with dismissal he made a decision about what he was going to do. (Luke 16:4) He was not going to be working for anyone else; he was not going to dig or beg (v 3). It is plain that even when he was supposed to be looking after his master's household his priority was to look after himself. His priority would not change; he would continue to look after himself.

It is a principle of life that entices every one of us. If you really want something badly enough, you can get it if you set your mind to it. On that basis, then, each one of us is doing what we have set our minds to do. If I really want to be a millionaire, and am willing to devote myself to that cause, there is nothing to stop me except my own lack of ambition in that regard. I am not a millionaire. Therefore, that is not my priority. But what am I? What is my priority? What have I set my mind to? As a Christian I am supposed to have answered that question. Like this steward I should be able to say confidently, "I know what I will do..."

This steward's priority meant that he needed to ingratiate himself with those who were his master's debtors. Jesus said that his master commended him for this (v 8) but He also adds the caveat that "the people of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own kind than are the people of the light." So how are the people of the light to act? Jesus goes on to say that we are to use worldly wealth to gain friends so that when it is gone, we will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. (v 9) How do we get from *worldly* wealth to *eternal* dwellings? It has to do with making friends. Are these *worldly* friends or are they *heavenly* friends? Based on Jesus' comparison between people of this world and people of the light and how they each deal with their *own kind*, I have to believe these friends are my *own kind*. And that means brothers and sisters in Christ. And that means *heavenly* friends. To put our church family first is consistent with the teachings of the New Testament.

Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers. (Galatians 6:10)

There is another important distinction that needs to be made between this *earthly* steward and us *heavenly* stewards.

He was being fired.

He was being fired because his priority was his own financial well-being. We are those who willingly serve our master and not worldly wealth. Ironically, we take a page out of the worldly steward's book by gaining more heavenly friends from out of the world. We do it by telling them that our master wants to cancel all their debts. I believe my master will be pleased with me if I do that and I will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. Therefore, I should be able to say, with confidence... "I know what I will do!"
