When you make up stories about good and evil, you will need to use biblical language and characters. Themes will always be drawn from real biblical events and prophecies that have been around for thousands of years. Here are some examples:

- Marvel comics did not invent the idea of the shield ("Agents of Shield")
 (Psalm 115:11) You who fear him trust in the LORD—he is their help and shield.
- God spoke of guardians long before there were "Guardians of the Galaxy".
 (Ezekiel 28:14) You were an anointed guardian cherub. I placed you; you were on the holy mountain of God; in the midst of the stones of fire you walked.
- DC Comics cannot claim to have originated the idea of "Flash" and "Arrow" (Zechariah 9:14) Then the LORD will appear over them; his arrow will flash like lightning. The Sovereign LORD will sound the trumpet; he will march in the storms of the south.
- And when it comes to women who can fly...(Wonder Woman)
 (Revelation 12:14) And to the woman were given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness, into her place, where she is nourished for a time, and times, and half a time, from the face of the serpent.

Can you think of any others?

The Bible is full of supernatural events as it documents God's battle with, and ultimate victory over, the Devil. There is no shortage of fantastic language and imagery. The difference is that the Bible story is true. Those of us who read it and believe it do not have to wait for the next episode to find out what happens.
