And so, God tells us to keep the confidence we had at the start line, and that is how we will make it to the finish line. Remember how *real* Jesus is, and PUSH ON! Feel again the *excitement* and the *hope* and RUN HARDER! **Drink in His love and power again and be refreshed!**

It helps to know that the One who *began* us is the One who will *finish* us, and that He runs with us always. When you run the LORD's race you are always on the finish line when you line up on His start line. So, keep the confidence you began with until the end and...
