The Wisdom of Solomon

Solomon became King after his father, David, and he demonstrated wisdom from the very beginning. However, there came a time when he ceased to follow his own advice. Let's trace his path of understanding: David acknowledged Solomon's wisdom when he charged him to deal with those who had been disloyal and with those who had been loyal to David. (1 Kings 2:1-9). Solomon showed his strength and wisdom in many cases in his early days in dealing with Adonijah, Abiathar, Joab and Shimei (1 Kings 2:13-46). He showed that he could not be persuaded by his own mother, or fooled by his peers, or cowed by his enemies.

There may be a clue to Solomon's weakness in 1 Kings 3:2-5. Solomon lacked the wisdom to shun the practice of worshiping at the "high places." Nevertheless, he continued to use his wisdom for good, as in the case of the prostitutes who both claimed to be the mother of one child. (1 Kings 3:16-28)

His wisdom included scientific knowledge of such things as plant life and wildlife (1 Kings 4:29-34) and building technology (1 Kings 5-7). There was no conflict between science and faith in Solomon's mind. After 20 years of building, his kingdom was the envy of any king who ever lived (except One), yet God still warned him to follow his father, David's, example (1 Kings 9:4-9). He was less than fair in dealing with King Hiram (9:10-14) and it seems safe to say that Solomon was becoming materialistic. Whereas his father, David, would be warring against foreigners, Solomon was seeking to impress them. He built an imposing throne for himself and began to accumulate chariots and horses more for exhibition than for security (1 Kings 10:26-29). His lack of judgment and obedience is seen in the fact that he "loved many foreign wives" (1 Kings 11:1-3) This, of course, led him into idolatry (11:4-8) and the Lord's anger was raised against him. (11:9-13)

We can learn much from Solomon. When we read the book of Proverbs we get a taste of just how great a gift of wisdom God bestowed upon this man. When we read Ecclesiastes, we get an idea of the awful torment he went through as he squandered this gift of wisdom in an effort to show just how wise he was. Let us not ever become enamored of the idea that imposing, gold-plated thrones are the sign of wisdom and strength. The wisest, strongest King who ever lived on Earth never had a place to lay His head, and did not even have a grave of His own to be laid in. They would have made Him a throne to be proud of, and I'm sure He could have had all the women He wanted, but what He wanted was just to go home and take us all with Him.
