Giving (AB)

This is not a popular topic, but it is vital that we address it occasionally. The usual question is "How much should I give?" but some people question if it is necessary to give at all. I believe that once we answer the question, "Why should I give?" we will be able to answer all other questions about giving quite easily.

Our contributions are used to support the work of the church, which includes supporting local evangelists and missionaries.

1Timothy 5:18 For the Scripture says, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it treads out the grain," and, "The laborer deserves his wages."

The early church used contributions to take care of large numbers of Christians who were remaining in Jerusalem after Pentecost (Acts 4:34,35), and there is instruction about taking care of widows in 1 Timothy 5:3-16. Thus, benevolence is a legitimate use of congregational funds.

Much can be said about how the funds are used but this does not answer the question, "Why should I give to the Church?" A good place to find the answer is in the book of Exodus. When the Israelites came out of Egypt and God gave them laws to live by, He also gave them a sacrificial system that required priests and a temple. The people were required to give animals for sacrifice in the Temple as part of their obligation to God under the Old Testament. In this way atonement was made for their sins and God could live among them. Atonement is a costly business and we know from the first time man sinned (Adam and Eve) that God clothed them with animal skins. All throughout history man's sins have been covered by other beings and Jesus Christ would ultimately serve as the Lamb of God to take away the sins of the world (John 1:29).

Although this price is a free gift, it is true that God expects us to give back to Him, and the question we should ask is "How much is my salvation worth?" We learn about this principle in Exodus 30:12.

"When you take the census of the people of Israel, then each shall give a ransom for his life to the LORD when you number them, that there be no plague among them when you number them.

God commands all men over 20 years old to pay an offering of half a shekel for atonement. This was in addition to all the regular offerings and tithes. Atonement is a costly business and the people of God should avoid ever being asked the question, "Will a man rob God?" (Malachi 3:8). In Leviticus 13:15, God recalls how He passed over the firstborn of Israel when He put the firstborn in Egypt to death, but He says that Israel's firstborn He redeemed.

Atonement (redemption) is a costly business and the early church did not hesitate to show how precious their salvation was. They showed it in their living and in their giving, and God blessed them mightily. We know that he who sows sparingly will reap sparingly (2 Corinthians 9:6) but no amount of money can satisfy the cost of redemption and no Christian who understands that will ever think about robbing God.
