How Do I Know?

Our understanding of our world, and how things work is based largely on the fact that just about everything has an opposite. If something were described as "dry" it would be meaningless to us if we did not know about "wet". How would we know what "light" is if there were no such thing as "dark"? Could you be tall in a world where there was no short? Could you be happy in a world where there was no sad? If we did not have the word sad in our language, we would not have the word happy, either. What if you were born in an isolated paradise where there was no such thing as hunger? One day a ship arrives that is full of starving people, and then more and more ships full of people arrive from a place where they know the word hunger. And now you know hunger too. You not only see hungry people, you must feed them, and there is not enough food anymore. Soon you too are hungry. You never knew the word satisfied until you became hungry; you were never conscious of being full until you became empty.

So much of what we know comes from knowing the opposite.

Here are some things that I know:

- I am a sinner; therefore, there must also be sinlessness somewhere.
- I will die, which means there must also be deathlessness somewhere.
- I have fears; therefore, there must also be fearlessness somewhere.
- I have time, so there must also be timelessness somewhere.

The more I think about Heaven, the more I have come to believe that it is a place with no opposites, no alternatives, and no choices. Mankind was born in an isolated paradise, and he knew no hunger. He had no concept of fear or doubt, but the forbidden fruit supplied the knowledge of the opposites of good and evil. You see, they could not know "good" until they knew "evil," also. We know they were good because the Bible tells us that God called everything that He had made "good" (Genesis 1:31), but I don't think they had the ability to think in terms of good or evil yet. For God to speak in those terms, however, there must have been evil around somewhere. Satan, the fallen angel, was already in rebellion against God, and he succeeded in breeding rebellion in mankind by supplying an alternative to God's Word, and convincing Adam to eat from the forbidden tree. Once he had eaten his fill, he became quite empty. He now knew hunger and he knew fear and he knew death, and he knew darkness. Having been banished from the Garden of Eden, life for man became harder and shorter and the tree of life faded almost from memory. In fact, if we did not have God's Word about that tree, we would not know about it. We would only know that dying is the process of giving up life, and that somehow, somewhere there must be the process of giving up death. There must be some other Adam who can get us started again, an Adam who will help us get back to that isolated paradise, an Adam who will love God as though there is no other choice. AB
