How Should We Pray for Enemies?

Recent developments in my home state of New York have caused me to reflect on a couple of big decisions.

- 1. Is it time to move out of NY?
- 2. How do I formulate prayer that satisfies my outrage and my faith?

Governor Cuomo and the Democrats who now control the state legislature have rolled back any protections for unborn children that Republicans had been defending. Mr. Cuomo has been outspoken about pro-lifers and anti-same-sex marriage proponents not being welcome in NY. One good brother calls this man the latest reincarnation of Caesar, and I wholeheartedly agree. His move to make abortion a "fundamental right" and the jubilant applause he has received from so many are hard to comprehend on many levels.

It is easy to feel helpless, but as Christians we must be assured that God hears our prayers. My question is, how should I pray about this outrage, or should I pray about matters outside the church at all? Most references to prayer in the New Testament are in the context of praying for brethren and even when encouraged to pray for kings (2 Timothy 2:1-3) it is for the benefit of the church. There is an example of prayer offered by the church on behalf of Peter when Herod imprisoned him (Acts 12:5). What happened next? Peter was miraculously rescued (12:6-19) and the next thing we read about is Herod being struck down by the hand of God (12:20-24).

Based on the Teachings of Jesus that we are to love and pray for our enemies (Matthew 5:44) we cannot conclude that the Church prayed for the death of Herod and we certainly acknowledge that vengeance is the LORD's (Romans 12:19). Again, this is referring to those who harm the brethren. Does it apply to those who harm the population in general, as is the case with NY abortion law? Given that true religion is defined as caring for widows and orphans in their affliction (James 1:27) I think it is a privilege to pray for these unborn children and their mothers and fathers.

I am asking God to thwart the plans of men, and women, that cause so much affliction, but I recognize that prayer must also include a request that was included when the church thanked God for Peter's safe return from an earlier encounter with authorities.

And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness (Acts 4:29)

A denial of the work of God in Christ always leads to madness and depravity, but our witness to the work of God in Christ must continue.
