Isaiah - Prophet for Gentiles

Accept one another then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth to confirm the promises made to the patriarchs, so that the Gentiles may glorify God for his mercy, as it is written: "Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing hymns to your name."

Again, it says, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people." And again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and sing praises to him, all you peoples." And again, Isaiah says, "The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; the Gentiles will hope in him." (Romans 15:7-12)

The first words of Isaiah make it clear that his prophecy is for Judah and Jerusalem (Isaiah 1:1). Why does Paul say that Gentiles are the beneficiaries of what Isaiah prophesied? Paul quotes also from David and Moses in the above verses, but only mentions Isaiah by name. It is as though he is identifying with Isaiah personally because Paul is unashamedly the "Apostle of the Gentiles" (Romans 11:13). Like Isaiah, Paul is calling out to his own people, the Jews. But, he is constantly putting his own people in the context of the Gentiles, which is the rest of the world. The word for Gentiles is the same word that is used to mean *nations* in both the Old and New Testaments. Can you imagine what it was like to be a Jew in the days when God did indeed make a distinction between Jews and the rest of the Earth's population? How confusing it must have been when they came under the dominion of other nations (Gentiles). Yet Isaiah, and other prophets, warned them that this would happen. They also promised that God would eventually liberate them from such bondage. How God would do that was to be even more startling than the fact that Gentiles could conquer Jews in the first place.

Isaiah is called the "Messianic Prophet" because he has many references to The Savior (Messiah). He refers to the incarnation in Chapter 9 and also to the death, burial and resurrection in Chapter 53. In Chapter 11, which Paul quotes above, Jesus is referred to as the "root of Jesse". Whenever this Messiah is mentioned by Isaiah you will find it in the context of him being involved as a savior of the Gentiles as well as Jews. That is the startling fact that Paul refers to as a "mystery" (Ephesians 3:3-6). Can you imagine living in the days when God was telling Jews that they needed the same Messiah that the Gentiles needed? Not only that but that they themselves were to be used in a way that would bring salvation to the Gentiles and vice versa!

Strange indeed, but now we know why Paul puts Jew and Gentile both in the context of needing a savior and then says, "Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you in order to bring praise to God."
