# **Thoughts on Giving**

#### **Old Testament:**

Leviticus 27:30-33: "Thus all the tithe of the land, of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree, is the Lord's; it is holy to the Lord. If, therefore, a man wishes to redeem part of his tithe, he shall add to it one-fifth of it. And for every tenth part of herd or flock, whatever passes under the rod, the tenth one shall be holy to the Lord. He is not to be concerned whether it is good or bad, nor shall he exchange it; or if he does exchange it, then both it and its substitute shall become holy. It shall not be redeemed."

Ten percent of all produce is the beginning of giving under the Old Testament. In addition to this, the law required regular offerings. A faithful Israelite might give up to 75% of his income. There were few who were faithful in this manner.

Malachi 3:8-12 Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions. You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you. Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the LORD of hosts. Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of delight, says the LORD of hosts

#### **New Testament:**

The interesting thing about the concept of tithing under the New Testament is its almost virtual absence. The basic principle is outlined by Paul as follows:

**2 Corinthians 9:6** "Now this I say, he who sows sparingly shall also reap sparingly; and he who sows bountifully shall also reap bountifully. **7** "Let each one do just as he has purposed in his heart; not grudgingly or under compulsion; for God loves a cheerful giver."

Giving back to God is a natural feature of the Christian life. There is no amount or proportion specified in the New Testament but we are called to give with purpose and with generosity and with cheerfulness. The early church used the contribution to support the preaching of God's Word and to meet the needs of the poor, with priority given to the saints. The Scriptures do not teach that the tithe is incumbent upon New Testament believers. However, they do teach that Christians are to be generous, sacrificial, expectant and cheerful givers!
