"The Age of Accountability" Arthur Barry

Our understanding about baptism as taught in the Bible is very clear. However, once we arrive at the conviction that a person needs to be baptized to be saved (E.g. Mark 16:16), we find that we need to go further with our thought process. One area of major concern for us is the question of infant baptism. Once we reject that concept we then have to form our concept of how young people do fit into the scriptural pattern for salvation. The Bible does not address the question directly, but we reason from the scriptures that a newborn cannot have faith and, therefore, cannot be faithfully baptized. It might be better to say that a newborn does not need faith and therefore does not need to be baptized. The reason they do not come under that commandment is that they are not under the burden of sin. So at what point do they come under that burden and as a result need to be faithfully baptized?

We have a phrase "age of accountability" which applies to this transition that a child makes from the state of not being accountable for sin to the state of being accountable for sin. The phrase is not found in the Bible, however, and sometimes it may seem that we are making up our own rules about these things. In fact, nowhere in the New Testament will you find any discussion about how to treat children in regard to salvation. How do we know that God recognizes this "age of accountability"? Are we just following our own reasoning and filling in the blanks when we say that there will come a time when the child will have to be baptized?

There are indeed scriptures that do state this principle, and it might be good to look at them.

Deuteronomy 1:39 'Moreover your little ones and your children, who you say will be victims, who today have no knowledge of good and evil, they shall go in there; to them I will give it, and they shall possess it.

Isaiah 7:14-16 "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel. Curds and honey He shall eat, that He may know to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the Child shall know to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land that you dread will be forsaken by both her kings.

So, although the exact words are not in the Bible, the principle certainly is. There is a before and after sense about accountability for sin. If we are going to promote the teaching about the age of accountability it behooves us to point out these scriptures. Also, if you look at these scriptures in light of James 4:17, you will see that there is a case for accountability in the New Testament.

Therefore, to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin. James is talking about a specific sin where Moses and Isaiah are talking about the general principle.
