IS YOUR NAME MEMORIALIZED IN HEAVEN?

The designer of the Vietnam memorial was Maya Lin, a Yale University architecture student who entered a nationwide competition to create a design for the monument. Lin, born in Ohio in 1959, was the daughter of Chinese immigrants.

Many veterans' groups were opposed to Lin's winning design, which lacked a standard memorial's heroic statues and stirring words. However, a remarkable shift in public opinion occurred in the months after the memorial's dedication. Veterans and families of the dead walked the black reflective wall, seeking the names of their loved ones killed in the conflict. Once the name was located, visitors often made an etching or left a private offering, from notes and flowers to dog tags and cans of beer.

The faithful have a place in Heaven and God watches over us. He watches over us here on Earth and also in Heaven. That has everything to do with the fact that Christians are those who have died to themselves in order to live for Christ.

For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. Colossians 3:3

The Bible actually tells us that our names are written in Heaven, and Paul talks about that:

Yes, I ask you also, true companion, help these women, who have labored side by side with me in the gospel together with Clement and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life. Philippians 4:3

There were those who wanted statues or inspiring words to be the memorial for those who died in Vietnam, but once they walked the wall and read the names, they were struck by the powerful witness they experienced. Thirty five years later that granite wall is still in good shape, but it won't last forever. Given enough time those names will become hard to read.

Imagine what it would be like to walk the memorial wall that is the book of life. There will be no erosion in Heaven; our names will be perfectly clear whenever we get there. How comforting it is to know that Jesus will not blot our name out of His book if we remain faithful. (Revelation 3:5)
