Is Jesus a Saint?

Kids can be quite provocative with their questions, can't they? The above question came from one of Sandy's students some years ago. I have to admit that when she told me about it, I had to think for a bit. What would you say if someone asked you that question?

To be a saint is something to be proud of if you are a human, but surely Jesus is so much more than just a saint. So, let us review exactly what it means to be a saint and see whether Jesus is one.

- 1. The word comes from the Greek *hagios* which means "set apart" or "holy".
- 2. Of 45 occurrences of the English word "saint" in the New Testament not one is singular; it is always "saints". This term is always used to speak of *living* members of the Lord's Church (E.g., Romans 1:7)
- The term is always used of those who are alive on earth. The
 closest connection you will find with death, in the Bible, is in
 Revelation where saints have died for their faith (E.g., Revelation
 16:6) but there is no suggestion that this is how they acquired
 sainthood.
- 4. Those who are in the habit of attributing sainthood to certain people who have died after living a faithful life will actually use "saint" as a title, E.g., "Saint John" or "Saint Paul". However, no one ever calls Jesus "Saint Jesus." The appropriate title is "Lord Jesus" (Mark 16:19)
- 5. In fact, Jesus is actually called "King of saints" in Revelation 15:3 (The NIV has "king of ages", but the word is actually *hagios*).

He was also called "King of the Jews" (Mark 15:26). Does the fact that He is king disqualify Him from being a Jew? Not really. In fact, He had to be a Jew to qualify to be King of the Jews. So, does being King of the saints disqualify Him from being a saint? No, it does not. If you look up the Greek word for saint (hagios) you will find that it is used many more times than the instances where it is translated "saint". In Mark 1:24 we read this. "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Here the word is translated "The Holy One" and this title refers only to Jesus. In this case it is singular and has the definite article with it. In other words, he is <u>The</u> Saint of God, not just <u>a</u> saint. In the same way we understand that Jesus is <u>The</u> Son of God, but Christians are all "sons of God" (1 John 3:1). If He were not <u>The</u> Son then no one could be a son, and if He is not <u>the</u> Holy One (saint) then no one can be a saint.
