# The Flesh Was Willing but the Spirit Was Weak

When Jesus was in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, His disciples were hard pressed to stay awake. (Mark 14:32-42) Jesus was praying to His Father in hopes that the storm that was about to fall upon Him could pass by and leave Him alone. He had seen the clouds gathering and already the cruel winds were driving hard all around Him. He knew that He could not weather this storm. He must move out of its way or else He must be destroyed by it. His disciples could not see the storm, however. There were no winds blowing against them. The only struggle for them was the struggle to keep their eyes open on a warm, quiet night on the Mount of Olives.

For three years they had been close companions of this man upon whom had fallen some unseen, terrible woe. He had amazed them with His powers and comforted them with His promises. They had traveled too far with Him to turn back now, even if they may have preferred to be at home in a nice, comfortable bed.

And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." Mark 14:37, 38

Sometimes you just have to sleep, but it seems extraordinary that not one of the disciples could stay awake. Usually at least one out of eleven will be able to resist sleep. Couldn't they have taken turns to stay awake? Couldn't they see the storm at all? They had nothing to say to Jesus. He was only a short distance from them, but He might as well have been on another planet.

Not too long before that night these men had been awake when Jesus was very tired and had fallen asleep. Sometimes you just have to sleep, but it seems extraordinary that Jesus could sleep then. He was very close, but it seemed like he might as well have been on another planet. Couldn't He see this storm? How could He not feel it and hear it? What kind of a sleep was it that had no response to howling winds and crashing waves? It would have been bad enough if He had been snuggled up in bed in a home, but here He was in the bow of a boat on the Sea of Galilee...

"And they went and woke him, saying, "Master, Master, we are perishing!" And he awoke and rebuked the wind and the raging waves, and they ceased, and there was a calm. He said to them, "Where is your faith?" And they were afraid, and they marveled, saying to one another, "Who then is this, that he commands even winds and water, and they obey him?" Luke 8:24-25

I guess we could say, on this occasion, that the flesh was willing, but the spirit was weak. Those of us who have the spirit of Christ know that even if our physical eyes don't see Him, He is still right here and, should a storm descend upon us, it descends upon Him also. I have to think that Jesus knew that there would come a time when His disciples would fall asleep while He really needed their company in a time of storm. As disciples we may find ourselves robbed of sleep and possibly lacking in faith. The solution to such problems is to stay close to Him anyway.
