1. *Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another.*

Proverbs 27:17

2. *Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world.*

1 John 4:1

Both tell us we cannot live out our faith lives alone. One emphasizes the personal benefit of engaging others in fellowship, and one emphasizes the responsibility to engage others in order to protect that fellowship.

Proverbs 27:17 expresses the beauty of fellowship from the perspective that we all can help each other grow stronger through interaction with each other. The obvious conclusion is that we need **Christian interaction** with fellow Christians. When John wrote his epistle he was acutely aware of a threat to the very basis of that fellowship. Therefore, his admonishment was to "take on" false prophets by testing spirits. Iron sharpening iron is a reference to swords, and swords are weapons.

Ephesians 6:17 refers to a Christian's *sword of the spirit* as being the Word of God. Is there any doubt that in order for soldiers to fight together they must train together?

I have never really understood the *sport* of fencing, but it offers a helpful picture here. We need a partner to fence with if we are going to be good with a sword. So it is with God's Word; we need others to work out with. If there comes a time when the fellowship is threatened by false teaching, then the swordplay will come in useful.

Are you getting enough swordplay?
