How to Do Everything – by the Man Who Should Know

That is the title of a book by Steve Smith, the star of the popular sitcom sketch series "Red Green" from the '90s. It was sort of a Canadian version of "Home Improvement". His claim to fame was his incredible ability to make just about anything out of just about anything plus duct tape. The above mentioned book is full of such helpful ideas and quite a lot of practical advice about life in genera, l like suggestions to help you feel good about yourself, beginning with "remove all mirrors from your home."

The thing about Red Green is that, even though his inventions and suggestions are meant to make us laugh, much of what he says leaves me thinking, "hmm... that just might work!" There is usually something sensible about his madness.

As with Red Green's writings, there is a dose of madness in the wisdom, and a measure of wisdom in the madness, of the words we find in the book of Ecclesiastes. And I applied my heart to know wisdom and to know madness and folly. I perceived that this also is but a striving after wind. (Ecclesiastes 1:17)

The Bible book of Ecclesiastes is written by King Solomon and, despite the fact that duct tape is nowhere mentioned, there are some striking similarities in the way Solomon presents himself as one who should know whatever needs to be known. He boasts of having experienced heights of human accomplishment and pleasures beyond anything experienced by other men. So I became great and surpassed all who were before me in Jerusalem. Also my wisdom remained with me. And whatever my eyes desired I did not keep from them. I kept my heart from no pleasure, for my heart found pleasure in all my toil, and this was my reward for all my toil. (Ecclesiastes 2:9, 10)

Yet Solomon's words are bleak and his soul is heavy. There is no humor in what he sees in life. *Then I considered all that my hands had done and the toil I had expended in doing it, and behold, all was vanity and a striving after wind, and there was nothing to be gained under the sun.* (Ecclesiastes 2:11)

Solomon's dilemma is man's dilemma, amplified by the fact that he had unlimited power. We have incredible gifts from God, but we like to focus on our gifts and not the One who gave them to us. We convince ourselves that there is nothing to know beyond what we can see and do. This leads to madness and folly, which is only heightened by our attempts to make God a mere accomplice to vanity. When all is said and done, whether a king or a servant, we all need to hear Solomon's conclusion. *The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man.* (Ecclesiastes 12:13)

Fear of God opens a dimension beyond what we see and do and gives us victory over vanity. Fear of God should be the duct tape that we all apply to our lives.
