For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

Galatians 5:6

If you live long enough in this world you will come to one unavoidable conclusion: it is a hard place to win approval for any length of time. Everywhere you look, people are standing on their heads (metaphorically speaking) trying to get someone to notice and to say, "Good job! I wish I could do that." The trouble is that once they have said that, they move on, looking for something that is really worthwhile. They may be one step behind you or one step ahead of you, but we are all pretty much on the same track, following the same carrot. Standing on your head gets old, and jumping through hoops brings no satisfaction. Let's be honest--- it's just plain foolish.

Do you really expect to gain satisfaction today? Is it actually *possible* to hit the mark? I mean THE MARK, not *a* mark that might help you get to THE MARK. I mean THE MARK that you only ever need to hit one time. Paul wrote to the church in Galatia because he could see a bunch of people standing on their heads, and some who liked to pull the strings that made other people stand on their heads. What fools we are sometimes – thinking that pulling the strings is hitting THE MARK. Paul refers to this foolishness in Galatians 3:3:

Are you so foolish? After beginning with the Spirit, are you now trying to attain your goal by human effort?

He tells them that they had hit THE MARK when they began with the Spirit, when they had simply trusted Jesus by being baptized into Him (Galatians 3:26-29). It was good enough for their salvation then, why not now? We expect the world to be caught up in foolishness, but not people of faith. Paul warns them that if they want to go back to standing on their heads that they will have "fallen from grace" (Galatians 5:1-3).

Christians are people who have come to terms with their failure to hit the mark in this world. They no longer seek approval in this world because they know that THE MARK is Jesus. They seek to be at peace with all men and they definitely are admonished to encourage and support one another, because these things please God and hit the mark. But they can no longer be caught up in the foolishness of pleasing men. Paul had learned that lesson (Galatians 1:10). When he saw Peter "standing on his head" in Antioch (Galatians 2:11-14) he publicly denounced his actions. We should remember that when anyone attempts to change the terms of salvation to suit their own desires, and people fall in line to please men, God expects us to pronounce the anathema upon them. (Galatians 1:6-11)

Are you standing on your head or falling on your face? Are you really Spirit-led or falling from grace?
