The Haves and the Have-Nots [AB]

Then the disciples came and said to him, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" And he answered them, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given. For to the one who has, more will be given, and he will have an abundance, but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. Matthew 13:10-12

Parables are picturesque stories that reveal truth about God's Church, and they are not to be taken lightly. As Jesus teaches His disciples, they are becoming those to whom much has been given, and, as a result, they are able to gain even more. Unfortunately, the converse is true of those who do not receive the teachings of Christ; they will lose everything. Jesus returns to this theme in a series of parables in Matthew 25. He warns against failing to "keep the light on for you" as we wait for Jesus to return (Matthew 25:1-13). Next, He warns of not putting to use the resources He has shared with us while we wait for him to return (Matthew 25:14-30). The Bible teaches that there are "Haves"- those who receive the Word, and "Have-Nots" - those who do not receive the Word. It is safe to say that the Word provides hope for those who have not received. They can still repent and receive it and thus escape being cast into outer darkness where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. It is also true that the Word provides warning that even those who receive the Word may yet end up in that place of torment (Matthew 25:28-30).

So, there is another category of receptacle for God's Word. We might call them the "Hads". The Parable of the Sower in Matthew 13 clearly identifies those who do not have (13:9), those who have but do not keep (13:20-22), and those in whom the word bears fruit and yields a hundredfold, or sixtyfold, or thirtyfold (13:23).

Which are you?

Are you keeping the light on for Jesus by putting God's Word to work in this world? Or have you stashed the gift that He gave you, His Holy Spirit? We may not like to hear this warning, but better to hear it now. Jesus shares these parables with us so He can say to us,

"Well done, good and faithful servant... Enter into the joy of your master" (Matthew 25:21)
