Attributes of love from 1 Corinthians 13:4-7.

4 It always trusts. (1 Cor 13:7)

Some versions say love "believes all things". Do you believe that? Is that what people mean when they talk about "unconditional love"? Are we not to question anything?

I profess to love the LORD, but I must also confess to having some doubt about this requirement to always trust. So, let's put my love to the test. We have an expression that fits this situation. We say, "I will give you the benefit of the doubt." Well, can I give God the benefit of the doubt? Of course, I can. Isn't that what Abraham did when he went willingly to the mountain to sacrifice his son, Isaac? How about Daniel's three friends, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego? When they were put to the test, they seemed to go even further than giving God the benefit of the doubt. Nebuchadnezzar was about to throw then in the fiery furnace, and they said,

"If this be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of your hand, O king. But if not, be it known to you, O king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up." (Daniel 3:17, 18)

When Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane, agonizing over his impending fate, He gave His Father the benefit of the doubt, and I have to believe that I can do it too.

The problem is that I must give God the benefit of the doubt when He asks me to give the benefit of doubt to others beside Himself. No fair! God gave His Son for me, so I know I can trust Him. I am confident that "all things work to the good for those who love the Lord" (Romans 8:29) I have no such confidence that all things work to the good for those who love you, however, and you could say the same about me. You and I are human and subject to sinful ways and lousy ideas and hurtful attitudes. If I am to love my brother in Christ, which is the context here, I will likely get hurt. The thing I need to remember is that when I love my brother in Christ, I am not giving him the benefit of the doubt; I am giving it to Jesus.

Paul was addressing people who were jealously vying for recognition because of the gifts God had given them. When they came to church, they brought their new toy gifts (speaking in tongues, prophecy, etc.,) but they left the lasting power of love outside.

Can't you just hear some of the comments in the diner at Corinth after church ...

"Did you see that fool, standing up in the corner prophesying while I was still speaking in tongues? I couldn't believe it."

God might well say, "I believe you are all fools, but I believe I can love you anyway" We can believe in the love of God for ourselves and for our brethren. We can love like He does and that may mean that we are called to warn, or reprimand, others occasionally. If you truly understand love, and always act out of love, you will never have to doubt that you are doing right. Do you believe that? Can you put your trust so completely in love?
