## A NEW KIND OF FISHING

While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they left their nets and followed him.

Matthew 4:18-20

They didn't ask questions, but simply dropped their nets and followed.

Jesus tends to invade the ordinary. He offers a challenge to two men who are deeply involved in the routine of everyday life. Imagine going to work today and having the Messiah drop in with a call to immediately drop what you are doing and follow Him wherever He chooses to take you. In addition, Jesus' call is to a new way of doing life. It is nothing less than a radical shift in purpose, outlook, and commitment. Forget the fish; we are going to catch *people*!

The challenge to move from the mundane to ministry is given to the men and women of every generation. It is a call to give up what we have for what God desires. The Christ asks us to respond to His call with an acceptance that moves us from the ordinary into the supernatural realm. Where Jesus leads He expects us to follow. When God calls He expects us to act on His call.
