Christmas Comes But Once A Year. Jesus Never Leaves!

Any Christian worth his salt will know that Christmas is a tradition of man. As such we should tread carefully as we involve ourselves with certain aspects of this special time of the year. Here are a few thoughts that can help us.

1. God has no commandment for Christians to observe anything only once a year.

In the Old Testament this was the case for major festivals such as Passover, which took place in the first month of the year (Numbers 9:5). Christians are not governed by the Old Testament, however. Jesus gave the command to observe the Lord's Supper, and through His apostles we learn that this was to be on the first day of the week, not the first month (Acts 20:7)

- 2. This world is mostly governed by impulses and ideas that come from man, not from God. This is true on any day of the year. In Romans 14:5, 6 Paul explains that as individuals we may keep certain days as special as long as we honor the LORD. So there is some personal latitude, but we cannot bind these things on others. That is why, for the church as a whole, Christmas has a low profile.
- 3. We are to be <u>in</u> this world but not <u>of</u> this world. How do we do that?

1 Corinthians 5:9, 10 tells us that we would have to leave the world if we wanted to isolate ourselves from all wrongdoing. Yet Paul, in this passage, does insist that we should isolate such wrongdoing if it occurs in the church. God does recognize that it can be hard to draw all the lines in the right places when we interact with the world, but the bottom line seems to be that we do not allow sin to find a home within the fellowship of the saints. That means we each have to think carefully and remember Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 7:31

...and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.
