Read Your Bible; Tune into Life

The daily Bible reading program has begun with this new year of 20**22** and we have read the first four chapters of Genesis as of today (Jan 2). In less than 30 minutes we have taken in the creation of the universe and the fall of man, and the effects of that fall leading to acts of murder. Our modern society expends huge amounts of resources in time and money trying to delve into the causes of strife and conflict that plague mankind. Physical and emotional turmoil prevails in our world and nobody is untouched by it. It only makes sense that we apply ourselves to finding remedies and do whatever it takes to eradicate the ills that mar our existence here on Earth, right?

The answers are right there in the Bible and, as we have said, it does not take much time at all to cut through all of man's meddling and get to the heart of the matter.
