How is your Spiritual Appetite?

Our tendency to eat too much natural food is not usually matched by our spiritual appetite. Having a good spiritual appetite means that we desire to do God's will; and when we do God's will we are nourished by God Himself. Eve, for example, saw that the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil was "good for food" in Genesis 3:6. That fruit did not harm her physically, but she disobeyed God, which meant that she was spiritually malnourished. She actually curbed, or spoiled, her appetite for God's will and excited her appetite for her own will. Another example of this principle is seen when we consider the concept of the Promised Land as a "land flowing with milk and honey". In Exodus 3:8 God promises Moses that He will lead the Israelites into a land flowing with milk and honey. That is a very positive image of sustenance. But listen how, not long after the Exodus, the people felt about Moses' involvement in their lives.

Isn't it enough that you have brought us up out of a land flowing with milk and honey to kill us in the desert? And now you also want to lord it over us? Numbers 16:13

The Israelites looked at Egypt flowing with milk and honey and they wanted to go back. In their minds Egypt had taken better care of them than God. Like Adam and Eve, they would not trust God and do His will. To do His will is to live in a land flowing with milk and honey. Just ask Jesus. "My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." John 4:34.

So any time we do God's will we are being fed from Heaven (Heaven's Kitchen), and every time we deny Him we are being fed from Hell (Hell's Kitchen). We must stimulate each other to do God's will. We must excite the appetite for the things of God's Kingdom and not for the things of this world. Jesus recognized that many have spoiled their appetite for God's Will. He told the Jews who were ready to kill Him that they had "no room for his Word" (John 8:37).

As a child I was constantly being warned that I would "spoil my appetite" by eating things that I enjoyed but that were not good for me. Very often when my mother had spent a lot of time preparing a hearty, healthy meal for me I would arrive home after stopping at the candy store and I would not have room for the good stuff. Adam and Eve spoiled their appetite, the Israelites spoiled their appetites and Satan would love for us to spoil our appetite for God's will by filling ourselves up on our own will. There was one who never spoiled His appetite, and His name is Jesus Christ.
