What's Good About Blood?

In the history of Israel there are times of disappointment and discouragement and also times of great revival and encouragement. When Israel was in rebellion, they neglected the commands of their God and actually served other gods. At times, however, they turned back to God in a dramatic way. Such occasions are always associated with a particular king. If the king did evil, then the nation did evil but if the king did what was right then the nation would do what was right. One of the worst examples was Ahaz:

Ahaz was twenty years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem for sixteen years. Unlike David his father, he did not do what was right in the eyes of the LORD. 2 Chronicles 28:1

This is something of an understatement for Ahaz was the king who actually shut the doors of the temple. (28:24) One of the best examples was his son, Hezekiah, who opened the temple up again and restored the true worship to Judah. He even beseeched those who remained in Israel to join them for the Passover celebration. That event is recorded in 2 Chronicles 30:13ff and there are a number of things about that Passover celebration that don't "go by the book" as we say. The people had not been faithful in keeping the Passover as a nation and King Hezekiah organized a Passover that is described this way.

There was great joy in Jerusalem, for since the days of Solomon son of David king of Israel there had been nothing like this in Jerusalem. 2 Chronicles 30:26

This was a huge celebration as so many of God's people renewed their covenant with Him. How it must have filled God's heart with Joy! The magnitude of these celebrations is reflected in the number of sacrifices that were offered. 2000 bulls and 17,000 lambs were contributed by the king (30:24). I can't help but think that animals are much better off when Israel is rebelling. During those times they just went through the motions of obeying God, if at all, and probably did not take too heavy a toll on the livestock with their sacrifices. But once they got a mind to repent and really show God how much He meant to them it seemed that rivers of blood had to flow as though it were a sin to leave any animal alive in the land. What's so good about blood? That would be my question if I were a bull or a lamb. "Please go back to your bad ways and let your own blood be on your heads, not mine!" But a bull or a lamb cannot speak, cannot resist God's will.

Jesus can speak and He can resist and yet He bleeds; He bleeds oceans, not rivers. He bleeds because men are bad, that is true. But isn't it more important that He bleeds to make men good? It is when we turn to Him that the blood flows and angels rejoice. It is then that God forgives us. It is then that God can cradle us, like lambs, in His loving arms.

That is what is good about blood.
