Regardless of our living condition on this earth, we must never forget where our real home is. We might be better served to consider ourselves homeless while here. And as we journey through this wilderness of life on earth filled with its struggles and difficulties, let's not forget that God is right here with us, willing to become homeless alongside us, so that He can lead us to the wonderful home that He's prepared for us- with Him!
