## Last Day (AB)

This is the last Sunday of the year of our LORD, two thousand, twenty three. Tomorrow, if the LORD wills, we will begin the year of our LORD, two thousand, twenty four.

Why do we celebrate ends and beginnings? Birthdays, seasons, anniversaries, etc... They carry emotional significance for everyone but, as Christians, we hope for eternal newness, and God does promise that blessing to us.

Romans 6:4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

Bearing in mind that the entire revelation of God speaks of Messiah and the resurrection to eternal life, we see why ends and beginnings are such a huge part of our psyche. So, when Jesus went up to the Temple in Jerusalem in the middle of the Feast of Booths, it was on the last great day of the feast that He stood up and spoke the messianic promise to be a source of living water. That would be when He poured out the Holy Spirit after His resurrection and returned to Heaven. (John 7:37-39)

The last day of the Feast of Booths was the eighth day, which is technically the first day of a 7-day week. Jesus resurrected on the first day of the week, Sunday, and He poured out His Spirit on the day of Pentecost, which is 50 days after Passover (Leviticus 23:16). That is, one day after the 49<sup>th</sup> day, which would also be a Sunday. If the number seven is the measure of completeness, why does God use the concept of the eighth day so often? In the Bible we find that it applies to the dedication of animals, priests, the Temple, and of course it is the day that a male child is circumcised.

The number eight becomes the hope of newness because it goes beyond our normal measure... into a different measure altogether. Eight includes the seven but it brings the seven to an end. It is the beginning that will have no end. The LORD is the Alpha and the Omega because He is beyond them both, and He is the beginning and the end, because He is beyond them both. He is the one and the seven because He is beyond them both. Those of us who have the Spirit of Christ stand at the dawn of a new day that will never end. With that in mind.... Happy New Year!
