The Words of Joseph Arthur Barry

As we learn about Joseph, we learn about God and His ways... how He birthed an entire nation, through an ancestor of Joseph and He guarded and guided that one nation through centuries of turmoil, disaster, trials, and drama...how He steadfastly preserved and provided for His promise to bless all nations through the seed of Abraham. They are woven into this tapestry that we call history. Take those names out and the covenant hope crumbles; the revelation of God evaporates.

And here they are in Egypt, for the second time, seeking food supplies to take back to their father, Israel. Since their first visit, Simeon had remained in the custody of Joseph, until they returned with Benjamin. Jacob had very reluctantly agreed to let them take Benjamin on the second trip. You know the story...Benjamin was the second of Rachel's sons and Jacob believed the first, Joseph, was dead. Not only was Joseph not dead, but he was the most powerful man in the world.

He had just revealed that truth to his brothers, and it is hard to imagine what they were feeling. He had tortured them a bit...fair enough after what they had done to him. As the story unfolds, Jacob gets all his sons back, including Joseph, and the infant nation of Israel will move into Goshen where God will prepare them for the Exodus into the Promise Land. And, as Joseph opens their eyes and hearts to the reality of God's sovereign will and covenant faithfulness, he sums that all up in two statements that we need to think about today...
