## **Hearts Gone Out**

And by their prayer for you, which long after you for the exceeding grace of God in you. 2 Corinthians 9:14 (NKJV)

There is an expression we used in England when I was growing up that referred to a person's lack of presence of mind. We would say "He's gone out". We have a similar expression in this country that goes like this, "He's out to lunch." If you are like me, perhaps you have experienced your mind "going out" occasionally. Sometimes we just say a person has "lost their mind." Well, the New International Version of the Bible has a nice way of rendering the above verse. It goes like this, "And in their prayers for you their hearts will go out to you because of the surpassing grace God has given you."

Has your heart ever "gone out"? Isn't that a lovely expression? Something strikes you with such beauty that it tugs at your heart...tugs it hard enough to steal it from you. Perhaps it was a cuddly puppy, or an adorable baby. And you were unashamed to be among those whose hearts have gone out. It might be the one you fall in love with, and spend the rest of your life in love with. The idea is that a longing is produced within you and the focus of that longing is outside of yourself. What was it about these Corinthians that would produce such longing in other Christians? Paul says it is because...

...they glorify God for the obedience of your confession to the gospel of Christ, and for your liberal sharing with them and all men,

( 2 Corinthians 9:13)

Paul is commending them for their giving. He had been asking the Corinthians to help with needs of the Christians in Jerusalem. God loves a cheerful giver (9:7). His heart is moved when His children show generosity. In fact you might say His heart goes out to them.
