Is it Wrong?

There are obviously things that Scripture says are wrong. "Sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these" (Galatians 5:19-21). But there are other behaviors about which we are not given such an obvious answer.

The Problem with Only Asking, "Is It Wrong?"

Have you ever heard a person ask "Show me in the Bible where it's wrong!"? This was apparently the mentality of some people who stirred up quite a bit of trouble in the Corinthian church. They seemed to believe, since Christians are not under Law but under grace that, "All things are lawful." Paul was quick to reply, "But not all things are helpful" and, "Not all things build up" (1 Corinthians 10:23). These people believed that if the Law of Moses had been done away with, they had complete freedom to do *whatever* they wanted to do. Paul rebuked them and said there were other questions that needed to be asked rather than just, "Is it lawful?"

Christian living is not about rule-keeping. There are more questions that need to be asked than just, "Is it against the rules?" Christian living is about walking by faith (2 Corinthians 5:7), walking by the Spirit (Galatians 5:16-26), and walking in the light (1 John 1:7). Which means we are called to a higher standard and we have to ask more mature questions than just, "Is it wrong?" or, "Is it lawful?" or, "Is it against the rules?"

What Other Questions Should We Ask?

Before engaging in a particular behavior, here are some questions we should ask ourselves:

- Is it wise? see the book of Proverbs
- Is it helpful and edifying to others? see 1 Corinthians 10:23-30; Romans 14-15
- Is it loving? see 1 Corinthians 13
- Is it selfless? see Philippians 2:1-11
- Is it God-glorifying? see 1 Corinthians 10:31-33
- **Does it reflect purity and holiness?** see 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8; Ephesians 5:7-21

This really is not as complicated as it might sound when you consider that Jesus summed it up with a few words in Matthew 7:12.

So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.
