Their Lives in Our Hands

There are countless souls around us who are "dead in sin" (Ephesians 2:1) with no hope of removing that sin by themselves. There is only One who can remove that sin and He is Jesus, the Christ, Son of God. As I reflect on the last few months in dealing with cancer, I see some direct correlation with the process of salvation. I have childhood memories of watching a program on television called "Your Life in Their Hands". It was a graphic documentary which showed various surgical procedures and was difficult to watch even in black and white. As Christians we must acknowledge that the lives of lost souls, who are looking for healing, are in our hands.

I had no way of removing my own cancer but, thankfully, we have a health care system that directed me to someone who could take care of it for me. Once my condition was officially diagnosed, I had to make the decision to have the cancer surgically removed, or not; I had to verbally respond to the question, "Do you want to go ahead with surgery?" My life was in the hands of my surgeon and his team at that point.

Jesus works with His team, and that team is His Church. He sends us to the lost with the good news that He can remove their sin, but they must accept His offer. God's Word leaves no doubt that sin is removed when one is baptized in the name of Jesus and that God bestows His Spirit on us once we are cleansed of sin (Acts 2:38).

I have heard perspectives about this process that are troubling. For example, the idea that people who believe must wait to be baptized till it is convenient, which can mean waiting up to a year in some cases. This defies the biblical teaching about sin, death, and salvation. Can such teaching come from the team that Jesus sent into the world? How would I feel about a surgeon who gets me to commit to life-saving surgery then tells me to come back in a year for the procedure?

If it is true that Baptism now saves us (1 Peter 3:21) and we encounter sinners who want to be saved, then we should be crying out, "And now why do you wait? Rise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on his name" (Acts 22:16). Jesus has given the lives of mankind into the hands of His followers. We are the team that calls sinners to be washed in the blood of the Lamb. How dare we accommodate the need for convenience by delaying the saving work of Jesus?

Love gives no thought to convenience.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.
