He Endured the Cross

...Fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. - Hebrews 12:2

I find it difficult to focus for very long upon the excruciating experience of Jesus on the Cross. Mel Gibson's The Passion of the Christ was eye-opening, but also heart-wrenching. If we have any love at all for Jesus, we are pained to consider the brutal experience of the events leading up to and including his crucifixion on that dark day. I do think it is a dangerous thing, however, to avoid the image of the cross altogether. We should not find ourselves in such empathy that we shift immediately to the resurrection.

We should stay with the cross for a time. As we consider the seven sayings of Jesus on the cross we are exposed to the thoughts of the dying Savior. The immense pain, both physically and spiritually, of Jesus on the cross did not remove him from his mission nor his heart for humanity. The suffering of the Messiah is a reminder of the great price that was paid so that we could be freed from the eternal consequences of our sin.

Who Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, so that having died to sin, we might live to righteousness; by His wounds you were healed. 1 Peter 2:24,

The beautiful old hymn Rock of Ages was written by Augustus Toplady. He died in 1779 at the age of 38 of consumption. As he neared the end of his earthly life, he said, "My prayers are now all converted into praise." This can only be true because of the cross.

Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling, Naked, come to Thee for dress: Helpless, look to Thee for grace: Foul, I to the fountain fly; Wash me, Savior, or I die.

In a more contemporary hymn, we sing, "Thank you for the cross, Lord." Yes, this instrument of death was experienced by Jesus so that we could find release from death.
