Structure or Stricture?

Structure:	a. Something (as a building) that is constructed b: Something
	arranged in a definite pattern of organization
Stricture:	A restraint, limit, or restriction.

Here are two words that look almost identical, and can seem to be very close in meaning, or very far apart, depending on one's attitude. One of the arguments we hear when we are sharing our faith sounds like this, "I don't need organized religion. I just worship God in my own way." What does that mean?

"Organized religion" is a term by which people refer to church. The idea is that if there is such a thing as "organized religion" then there must be a "non-organized" religion. If we accept that proposition, then it must be OK to belong to non-organized religion. So, you and I may see the church as providing valuable structure (organization) to our lives, but another person may see it as enforcing unnecessary strictures (limits) on his or her life. In other words, how can Jesus promise to set us free if He demands that we belong to His church?

And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. Matthew 16:18.

To me Jesus is talking about a valuable structure, but to many people He is talking about a restrictive meddlesome group of people.

Psychologists tell us that structure is necessary, and by that they mean that we need to have boundaries or limits. This idea of establishing boundaries in behavior definitely applies to children. Not all children feel like going to school, but we actually have laws that say they must go. A regular daily schedule, established times for eating, going to bed, etc., makes a child feel secure. How about adults? Well, most of us prefer to live in houses than to roam the streets, and when we go to bed, we like to have a bed to get into instead of just lying down anywhere on the floor. When we drive, we usually prefer to stay within the confines of the road rather than to just let the car go where it wants to. We choose law and order and structure for the most part because if society and our lives were not controlled there would be chaos. Unfortunately, when it comes to religion, particularly Christianity, many people adopt a different approach.

Freedom in Christ is freedom from sin and death (Romans 8:2). However, many prefer to be free *to* sin rather than be free *from* sin.

One of the cultural clashes that is going on in this country right now is the debate over whether society is better off with more government or less government. Some believe that freedom is eroded by more government whereas others believe that freedom is protected by more government. It is sad that most people tend to spend lots of time thinking about how to live their physical lives yet seem to arrive at a belief system that impacts their spiritual lives without giving it much thought.

What do you think? Is church structure or stricture – or both?
