Strangers Scattered Abroad

Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To God's elect, strangers in the world, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia and Bithynia, who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and sprinkling by his blood: Grace and peace be yours in abundance. Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 1 Peter 1:3

Peter was recognized as the apostle to the Jews (Galatians 2:8) and when he writes this letter he uses some typically Jewish language. Eg. But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. (1 Peter 2:9).

Is Peter writing to Jews in his letter(s)? His greeting to strangers in the world scattered throughout the region sounds very Jewish. Some of these phrases might seem misplaced if he was talking to Gentiles but let us look at some other phrases that would be misplaced if he was talking to Jews.

As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. 1 Peter 1:14. This is much more appropriate for Gentiles.

1 Peter 2:9 speaks of them having been called out darkness into His marvelous light. Darkness would naturally refer to heathens and not Jews. The most obvious reference would be from 1 Peter 2:10 where they are described as not being a people in times past but now they are the people of God. This is always a biblical expression referring to Gentiles particularly.

Peter obviously expects his readers to understand him, so they must have had some significant exposure to Judaism. It is very likely that Jews and Gentiles were both being addressed. At the very least it was unlikely that some Jewish person had not been involved in teaching them initially. We must not be too rigid in the use of Peter's expressions when determining who he was writing to. After all it was a new reality that Gentiles are now part of the chosen people and it was also a new reality that Jews were actually in darkness prior to being baptized into Christ. Jews and Gentiles had a lot of adjustments to make in their thinking about each other, but at the end of the letter Peter lets us know who he is writing to when he says,

"Peace to all who are in Christ" (1 Peter 5:14)
