Paul's Winning Way

The Apostle Paul's philosophy about winning is seen in his teaching in 1 Corinthians 9:19-27. Paul shows us that his philosophy of winning is much different than the prevailing worldview about winning. He actually does whatever he can to WIN, but when Paul talks about winning, he means winning souls. When he talks about "winning" he means "saving".

His basic plan is stated in the following verses.

Though I am free and belong to no man, I make myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible.

1 Corinthians 9:19

To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some.

1 Corinthians 9:22

And yet Paul is not unaware that winning also means "beating", and we all know that a winner is someone who beats the competition. In this same passage Paul does talk about beating his competition, but, again, there is a surprise for us if we are thinking the way the world thinks. Here is what Paul has to say:

Therefore, I do not run like a man running aimlessly;
I do not fight like a man beating the air.
No, I beat my body and make it my slave
so that after I have preached to others,
I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.

1 Corinthians 9:26,27

To Paul, his competition is his own body, and if he is to win others, he must beat himself; he must bring his own body into submission. You don't have to live in this world for very long to find out that there is no warrior as fearsome as self. When we go up against ourselves, we face a ruthless and relentless champion who does not like to be beaten and who has countless ways of defending his or her domain. Paul teaches us not to underestimate the power of this competition. If you think you have to train hard to beat others, do not think you have to train any less hard to win others.
